Mary Courtney formed Morning Star in 1982 in the Bronx. Since then they have recorded several albums, and played at a variety of festivals across the USA. Morning Star features Kerry born Mary Courtney, whose voice has a beauty, depth, and clarity of tone that few can equal. John Redmond, a Wexford man, is the driving force in a joyous cascade of jigs and reels, one of the finest button accordion players of our time, with a bright and lively waterfall of sound that melds perfectly with

Mary's voice. A key element in the high energy of Morning Star is Donie Ryan on tenor banjo, from Co Tipperary, a rock solid player who is always note for note, with a deft and lyrical touch that blends perfectly with John's accordion and Mary's guitar. Morning Star beguiles the listener with compelling grace and boundless energy, certain to lift your feet and your spirit.

Armagh native **Cillian Vallely** has established his name over the last decade through his playing with

award-winning traditional Irish supergroup Lunasa that was described by the New York Times as "the hottest acoustic band in the world".Influenced by the rhythmic, flowing style of Paddy Keenan and

Johnny Doran, Vallely's mastery of chanter, drones and regulators has earned a reputation as one of the top players in the tradition. He has performed worldwide on tours as diverse as Riverdance, Natalie Merchant, Mary Chapin-Carpenter, Tim O 'Brien, and the "Celtic Jazz Collective" with Miles Davis' drummer Lewis Nash and bassist Peter Washington. He has also recorded on over 40 albums including six with Lunasa, "Callan Bridge" with his brother Niall and various guest spots with Natalie Merchant, "Excalibur" with Fairport Convention and Moody Blues, "GAIA" with the Prague Philharmonic Orchestra, and Karan Casey.

New York state singer and guitarist **Ryan McGiver** is known on either side of the Atlantic for his unique blend of open string guitar and breathy, eerie vocals.

Over the past decade he has performed extensively throughout North America, Europe and Asia and his music has been showcased on the BBC, RTÉ Raidió na Gaeltachta, NPR and The Lantern Journal. He has recorded and shared the stage with an eclectic blend of folk and rock musicians including Susan McKeown, Jolie Holland, Pádraig Rynne, Doug Wieselman, Vishtèn, Cillian Vallely and Shahzad Ismaily to name a few. His recent debut solo album entitled 'Troubled in Mind' is receiving international acclaim.

Shannon has performed at theaters, and festivals all over North America and Ireland, including the Kennedy Center, The Birchmere (VA), Comhaltas Ceoltori Eirann North American Convention, ICONS Festival (Boston), Saline Celic Festival (MI), the University of Milwaulkee Sean-nos Festival (WI), Choilin Sean Dharach Festival (Ireland), Brennan's (Nova Scotia), Greyfox Music Festival (NY), the Institute of Musical Traditions (MD), the Rams Head (MD), Potomac Celtic Festival (VA) and the Mainstay (MD).

In addition, she tours internationally with Childsplay, Kitchen Quartet, The Wren Girls: American Women in Sean-nos Dance and was a principal dancer with Footworks Percussive Dance Ensemble from 2007-2010. She has appeared as guest artist with world renowned Irish music acts, such as The Teetotalers, Solas, Flook, Karan Casey, Kevin Crawford, Killian Vallely, Tony DeMarco, Tim O'Brien, and Oldtime Music Hero, Bruce Molsky. Her extensive theater resume includes work with Award Winning Synetic Theater (Company, 2005-2007), Theater Alliance, Scena Theater, and Young Playwright's Theater.

Shannon is a renowned teacher of Sean-nos dance, having studied with Mick Mulkerrin & Mairead Casey, Aidan Vaughan, Paidraic O'Hoibicin, Roisin NiMhanin and Patrick O'Dea.

She is the recipient of many awards and honors, including the 2008 Dance Fellowship and multiple Folk Arts Grants from the DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities. She is on the roster of the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation, and was the recipient of a Performers Grant from the University of Milwaukee.

Irish Traditional Music Sessions: Every 1st Friday of the Month [please note we have moved the session from the 3rd Friday to the 1st Friday]

from 8:00 -9:00 there is a **slow session**. This is a traditional Irish session in all ways except one: the tempo. You will play common session tunes at a slower than normal pace, so that beginning and intermediate players can more easily learn the tunes and join in the session. Also great for experienced players who are picking up another instrument!

Ceili Dance: Every 4th Friday of the Month at 8:00 p.m. there is a Ceili at the Commodore Barry Club. A Ceili (kay-lee) is a traditional Irish gathering for fun, fellowship, and laughs (or craic as the Irish might say). Traditional Ceili dances were enjoyed at house parties and crossroads gatherings in the rural country sides. There are several dances which are easy for beginners to learn, such as, Haymaker's jig, Siege of Ennis, Fairy Reel, etc. Many of these traditional dances have a follow the leader pattern that new dancers can easily pickup on their 1st attempt. Our dance caller will teach the basic 3's, 7s, jig step, and Ceili swing at the start of the event. Come early (7:30 ish) and learn the basic steps while meeting new friends! You'll never learn if you don't try. Cost is \$12.00 when there is live music, \$10 when its recorded music unless otherwise noted.
